The 97th Annual Gold Medal Juried Exhibition was an evening of fine art and even finer sales.

ohn Asaro (painting) and Christopher Slatoff (sculpture) were given the Gold Medal Award at the California Art Club's 97th Annual Gold Medal Juried Exhibition, which took place April 25 and 26 at the Pasadena Museum of California Art. Asaro won the painting award for his new work titled *Pavane for a Dead Princess*, while Slatoff won the sculpture award for his piece titled *Fr. Electrico*.

Sales during the opening weekend of the exhibition were brisk, especially at the Collectors' Circle Benefit Dinner on April 25. Paintings by artists like Kathleen Dunphy, Amery Bohling, Mian Situ, Tony Peters, Lindsay Goodwin, Tony Pro, Clyde Aspevig, Ariana Richards and Paul Panossian all sold on opening night.

Paul Panossian's piece, California Gold, received the American Art Collector Award of Excellence at this year's show. American Art Collector editor Joshua Rose was at the event all weekend, meeting with artists and collectors. The weekend started Friday evening with the Collectors' Circle Benefit Dinner, an event attended by over 250 collectors. The evening culminated in a speech by Michael Zakian, director of the Frederick R. Weissman Museum of Art.

Saturday night was the Artists' Gala Reception and was attended by the participating artists and their families. More than 500 people were in attendance for the Gala and the event, held the evening before the display of contemporary-traditional art opened to the public. Art lovers and collectors had the opportunity to meet many of the artists and learn who received honors for their works on view in the exhibition.
